ENTRY REQUIREMENTS

- A Bachelor's degree requiring at least four years of full-time study in a relevant field, and which normally includes a research component in the fourth year, leading to an Honours 1 or 2A in a relevant field; OR
- A course leading to a level rated by the relevant department, faculty and committee as equivalent to an Honours 1 or 2A in a relevant field; OR
- A Master's degree that entails work, normally including a significant research component, including at least 25% of one full time equivalent year of work, including a thesis. It is normally expected that a grade of Honours 2A has been obtained for the research thesis or project. Where ungraded, examiners' reports will be taken into account; OR
- Qualifications which in the opinion of the Monash Graduate Research Committee are deemed equivalent.

Some practice-based programs have additional admission requirements.

ENGLISH LANGUAGE REQUIREMENTS

You'll need sound English language skills for graduate research. If your first language is not English, the language criteria must be satisfied in either:

- Language of instruction
- English Language Test
- Monash English Bridging (MEB) Program

VIETNAM PROJECT 89 PHD SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

This scholarship program supports high-quality Vietnamese candidates to undertake a PhD at Monash University. Applicants can elect to study in Melbourne or be based at a Vietnamese University, jointly supervised as an external offshore candidate. Awardees receive a tuition fee scholarship, stipend, travel allowances and health cover for the time spent in Australia.

HOW TO APPLY

First, check that you are eligible and satisfy all entry requirements (including English language requirements).

PROJECT 89 PHD SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION

If you would like to apply for the Project 89 PhD Scholarship Program, register your interest to Monash via email: **ge-HDR@monash.edu**. The team will guide you through the next steps, which will involve registering your interest with your Vietnamese institution, and submitting an Expression of Interest (EOI) to the relevant Faculty at Monash.

GENERAL APPLICATION

If you do not wish to apply for the Project 89 PhD Scholarship Program, you are only required to submit an Expression of Interest (EOI) to the relevant Faculty at Monash. Other scholarships are also available to apply for if you intend to study in Melbourne.

WHAT HAPPENS NEXT

If successful, you will receive an invitation to apply directly to Monash. Within your application, you'll be asked to upload copies of documents which include at least:

- Academic curriculum vitae
- Translated academic transcripts
- Proof of citizenship
- Proof of meeting the University's English language proficiency
- Invitation to apply
- Research proposal
