



Preparing PhD Applications for Success at Monash University



FUNDING & SCHOLARSHIP OPPORTUNITIES

Monash University offers a range of scholarships that are available to Vietnamese PhD candidates:

- Research Training Program (RTP) Stipend funded by the Australian government
- Monash Graduate Research Scholarship (MGS) funded by Monash University
- Sir James McNeill Foundation Postgraduate Research Scholarship established in memory of Sir James McNeill, study areas include Music; Engineering; Science and Medicine
- Monash Departmental Scholarship funded by faculties or departments at Monash University
- Monash International Tuition Scholarship (MITS) funded by Monash, covers tuition fees and single OSHC cover, generally awarded together with a stipend scholarship
- Monash University Vietnam Government Joint Scholarship (Project 89) funded by the Vietnamese MOET and topped up by Monash

Monash University also offers other awards and grants to help candidates throughout their enrolment:

- Travel Grant for study-related travels domestically or internationally
- Graduate Research Completion Award to provide support to students in their final year
- Postgraduate Publication Award provides funding to high-achieving students for preparation and publication of papers arising from thesis
- Mollie Holman Award best thesis of the year
- Vice-Chancellor's International Inter-campus PhD Travel Grant one-off grant to subsidise a visit to one of MU's international locations (Malaysia; Indonesia; Suzhou; Prato; India)

Step one

Identify your research interest and draft a <u>research proposal</u>.

Step two

Identify research supervisors you are keen to work with and check the relevant University's PhD entrance requirements



How to Prepare a Research Proposal?

Below is a sample guide of a research proposal format (approximately 3-4 pages)

Description of proposed project

- Project title
- Research topic summary (a few sentences that encapsulate the project)
- Project description (describe the proposed project including any relevant theoretical contexts)
- Rationale for project (what motivated your interest in this area)
- Main research questions (3-4 questions that underpin the investigation or research topic)
- Methodology (research methods, e.g. interviews, experiments, ethnography etc)
- Outcomes of this research and its contribution to knowledge
- Bibliography

NOTE: different faculties or disciplines may have different requirements for the PhD research proposal. Please consult with the relevant university or faculty if unsure.



How to Look for Supervisors?

Choosing the right (suitable and appropriate) supervisor/s is one of the crucial steps in starting the PhD journey.

1. Search for potential supervisors online

- Do you have a sense of who the leading academics are in your propose field of research?
- If not, search online. Search for academics with the same interests as you, look into their profiles, read about their research and publications

2. Create a shortlist

Create a list of the academics you are interested to work with as some of them may not be in a position to accept PhD students

3. Make initial contact

- Send a personalized email to each academic you may wish to work with, with a brief description of your research proposal, reasons why you want to work with them, academic transcripts and any funding opportunities you have applied for.
- DO NOT bulk email supervisors as they are unlikely to respond ۲



How to Look for Supervisors Cont'd

4. Meet with your potential supervisors

 Potential supervisors will most likely want to interview you before they formally accept, but it's also important for you to find out what they are like in person. So while they assess you, you should also assess their expertise and experience; availability and commitment; professionalism; social rapport etc

5. Making the final decision

- If there are multiple supervisors who fit your brief, you will need to choose one or two. While it is possible and highly recommended to have at least two supervisors, you will most likely need to choose one to be the main supervisor, especially if they are at different institutions or in different countries.
- Find out more about their methods, approach and personality from current or former PhD students
- Take into consideration the university's ranking and reputation
- Know yourself and if the supervisor's style will suit you



How Are PhD Applications Assessed?

PhD applications are assessed holistically.

While the **academic track record** will have the greatest weighting, it is not the only achievement that is assessed. Other key components include: **research experience**; prior **prizes and awards**; **academic publications**; **quality and feasibility** of proposed PhD project

Some factors beyond the applicant's control may often be taken into consideration as well, such as **supervision availability**, and the project's fit with the university's/faculty's **strategic priorities**.



Academic Requirements

- Australian/NZ Bachelor's degree with First Class honours (H1) (or equivalent qualifications); OR
- Australian/NZ Master's degree with significant research component (at least 25% of one year full-time or 24 credit points) at the First Class or High Distinction level; OR
- International qualifications are assessed by universities for H1 equivalency – for example, an international Master's degree with a significant research component and an overall grade or GPA of qualification in the highest grading band; grade of research component in the highest grading band; ranking in cohort; university ranking/standing relevant to discipline
- Other criteria may apply

Supporting documents:

- Official academic transcripts, including the grading schema (English translation required)
- Examiners' reports (if applicable)



Research Experience

It is in the applicant's best interest to clearly articulate any additional research experience they may have had. These include, but are not limited to:

- Academic positions ullet
- Research assistant positions
- Internships .
- Professional positions that have direct relevance to proposed research •

NOTE: the key is to provide details of any employment or research experience that directly demonstrate the applicant's ability to undertake independent research at the doctoral level.

Supporting documents:

- Letter from employer, confirming duties and responsibilities
- Reference letter from former thesis supervisor/s
- CV



Research Outputs/Publications

Academic publications, especially those that are peer-reviewed are extremely important to be included in the PhD application:

- Publication type (e.g. book chapter, journal article, conference proceedings etc)
- Name of Publication (e.g. journal name; book title; publisher etc)
- Status (e.g. published; accepted for publication; under review)
- Quality of Journal or Publisher (e.g. impact factor; journal ranking etc)

Supporting documents:

- Proof of acceptance or publication of peer reviewed article or book chapter
- Copies of conference abstracts and the front pages (including contents page) for each publication
- Proof of any non-traditional research outputs (e.g. performances; folios; exhibitions; creative writing; translations etc) accompanied by a 300-word exegesis outlining the research contribution and relevance to PhD project



Prior Prizes/Awards/Scholarships

Prior prizes, awards, scholarships that were obtained through a competitive or merit-based process will be taken into consideration for PhD applications. These items will need to directly demonstrate the applicant's academic excellence and/or ability to undertake independent research.

Supporting documents:

- Award/prize certificate
- Scholarship offer letter
- Academic transcripts (if applicable)



English Language Proficiency Requirements

A university's ELP requirements could be met in a number of different ways:

- Language of Instruction (from a University approved country); or •
- English language test; or
- University English language bridging program

NOTE: different universities will have different ELP requirements

STEP 1: CHECK YOUR ELIGIBILITY FOR ENTRY

- Academic qualifications
- English language proficiency
- Other criteria may apply

1. Check your eligibility

Admission into a Monash graduate research degree is dependent upon meeting the entry requirements specific to the course for which you are applying.

In response to the disruption caused by COVID-19, changes have been made to the grading and results for some teaching periods. Applicants currently completing their qualifying degree at Monash are encouraged to review these <u>changes</u>.

ADMISSION SCHOLARSHIPS DON'T MEET REQUIREMENTS?

Entry requirements

All graduate research degrees have minimum academic entry requirements which must be met by all applicants. Some courses have additional requirements which are outlined in the relevant course entry in the <u>Monash University</u> <u>handbook</u>.

The minimum academic entry requirements differ depending on the graduate research degree:

- Doctoral degree (PhD)
- Master's by research

English language proficiency

All graduate research degrees require sound English language skills. It is important you understand what English language proficiency requirements are applicable, noting that certain faculties have higher requirements. Should you be required to undertake an English language proficiency test, ensure you check which tests are accepted by Monash.

STEP 2: OBTAINING AN INVITATION TO APPLY

- Faculty specific process
- Review information and contact the faculty / academic unit responsible for your area of interest
 - Courses, how to find a supervisor etc
- Submit an expression of interest (EOI) to the relevant faculty.
- If your EOI is successful, the faculty will issue you with an Invitation to Apply

2. Submit an expression of interest

Prior to applying for a graduate research degree, you will need to submit an expression of interest (EOI) to the relevant faculty or academic unit.*

Each faculty has a different EOI process so please read any instructions provided carefully and make sure you are aware of any applicable closing dates, particularly if you are applying for a scholarship.

STEP 3: PREPARE DOCUMENTS

- Invitation to apply (from Step 2)
- Academic transcripts
- Research proposal

STEP 4: SUBMIT YOUR APPLICATION

- All applications are submitted online through the *Graduate Research Admission and Scholarship Application portal*.
- Admission-only applications are accepted all year round
- Admission with scholarship applications by closing date
 - International Applicants: 31 March & 31 August each year for respective intake

Note: Processing of applications takes approximately six weeks after submission or closing date
